## What is a city charter?

- Functions as city's constitution
- Creates city as legal entity
- Authorizes city powers
- Outlines basic, broad fundamentals of city government
- Concise
- Avoid need for frequent amendment
- Amended by the people





## **Periodic Charter Review**


"From time to time, but no less frequently than every 10 years, the Council shall convene a Charter review commission to review and recommend amendments to this Charter . . ."



## **Role of the Charter Commission**

- Determine its own rules of procedure
- Review and recommend amendments to the Charter
- Provide a written report of its findings to City Council







- How should we time city council elections?


